

Charities to Benefit from Spring Run Classic Written by Noel Cosca

All proceeds from the Spring Run Classic on April 17th to 19th will be donated to charity. This should be a Peach of a Race! Held at the beautiful Diamond Bar Arena in Ceres, California. This fine event is adding youth scholarship awards. New for this year is the Sherry Cervi West Coast Youth Championships. The SCWCYC may reach \$3000 in scholarships by race day. In addition to the \$2500 added cash, two new saddles will be awarded. A big thank you goes out to these new donations in scholarship awards: Robert Falk Horseshoeing \$100 scholarship, Hardesty Sand & Gravel \$500 Scholarship, and PacWest \$250 scholarship bringing the total scholarship money to \$2650 so far.

Shane Parson and Family have worked tersely to produce this fine event which will benefit many local charities. This 4D barrel race has \$8,000 total added money with \$5,000 added first thru 10th place \$3,000 added to extended payout 11th thru 20th place, based on last years entries. The race will be webcast live and includes a real crowd pleaser the dog races.

The Sidewinder Futurity with \$7500 added both Saturday and Sunday is Guaranteed to be a Peach of a Race, Bar None! This futurity is sponsored by Wawona Frozen Foods, Jud Little Ranch, and Thoro' Bred horse shoes. The SideWinder Futurity has teamed up with the Beth Cooper Memorial race and will provide buckles to the 1D & 2D combined average winners. If you enter both futurities you have the opportunity to win this very prestigious buckle.

There have been some changes to the Diamond Bar Arena. They have built a new center entry gate which allows for a standard pattern and 100 foot stopping area. The children's fenced in safe play area has new fun play ground items. The tree shaded grass sitting area has many new picnic tables and benches. Lasers have been mounted over the barrels for accuracy and they will have men moving the barrels for each drag so it will be a lot faster. They will drag after every 3 runs. The race will be webcast and they will be selling filmed runs at a reasonable price. The photographer

Jamie Cook riding Especial Minniehuna lead the race starting Friday night March 27th by winning the first go round with a 15.36 and she finished the BTM South race weekend in the same championship form. Cook won the 1D Average and took home \$1,920.97 for the weekend. Especial Minniehuna "Mini" for short is a five year old colt that Cook says "placed at all of the futurity races she entered last year but just started stepping up and got faster at the end." Cook, "feels like Mini has more and is not tapped off yet." Cook also wants to thank her sponsors Bar Ale and Synergy. She feeds the Mane Pellet milled by Bar Ale Products to all her horses which is a 12% alfalfa based pellet with mineral supplements including Selenium yeast and Biotin. Cook feeds the pellet in

place of hay for one feeding each day. She also supplements with Synergy vitamins, both Synergy and Bar Ale are BRN4D sponsors. Cook says that Mini "has a grasp of what he is doing and squeels in the warm up pen like a wild thing." Cook's other ride Triangle Ease "Sleezy" had a nice run to win the race on Sunday with a 15.247. Cook said "he was right there and she was happy with his run." C-T Productions adds \$3,400 added money and \$3,000 in average awards and had a total payout of \$24,000.00.

The 2D Average went to Joni
Raper riding Skip a Doc Black Bart aka
Bart. Raper's gelding is 12 years old and
Raper said "she's pretty darn excited" to
win the buckle. She remarked that her other
horse also did well and was 5th in the 2D
named Poco Bar Bingo aka Charlie who is a

13 year old rope horse she has been running for two years now. "Here at Tulare the ground is consistant, top or bottom of the ground, you just have to make a run." Raper came all the way from Gardnerville, Nevada and said "her family has such fun at Tulare, they stay with friends and the family gets to rope, golf and her girls five and nine years old get to swim."

Winning the 3D Average was
Cindy Roberts who rides I'm Another
Sunday a 17 year old gelding out of her
breeding. Roberts raised her horse by
breeding her throroughbred mare to a paint
horse. Roberts said, "she thought the awards
were wonderful and that the BTM South
team always makes sure that the ground is
awesome and safe for both horse and rider."

Kathy Branco took the 4D Average

riding Tanguray Time a five year old gelding by Touch Down Dancer out of Treasure Times which is one of Kathy's mares that won the California Futurity Championship in 1991. Branco said, "The BTM South races are a lot of fun and they treat you good." Branco took home \$365.49 in the open race.

Debbie Neeley had a good weekend riding her grey gelding Tie One On Angie aka Mailman out of White Tie. She bought her horse from the well known rodeo pick-up man Flint Hemsted. Pelowski's 9 year old buckskin gelding placed her in several go rounds and she pocketed \$525.48 for the weekend. Shelly has been riding KC for three years and said that "she has come a long way and feels like he is working well for her". She uses her horse on trail rides and working cattle. "KC used to be in the Riverside County Sheriffs Possie for a couple years and now she even gives lessons on him," said Pelowski.

Susan Davis riding Ruler "Ru" for short ran just out of the 1D payout on Sunday clocking a 15.496 on her big sorrel gelding. Sadly Susan lost her beautiful horse "Ru" after her run at the Oakdale Rodeo. The big gelding broke his pastern bone during his run in slack. We all want to give Susan our condolences for her loss of a great horse at the start of his rodeo career.

Saturday evening after the race there was another great pot-luck hosted by Steve Smart who entertained everyone with his guitar. Steve is the announcer at the races and everyone tells me they love his wide range of music.
