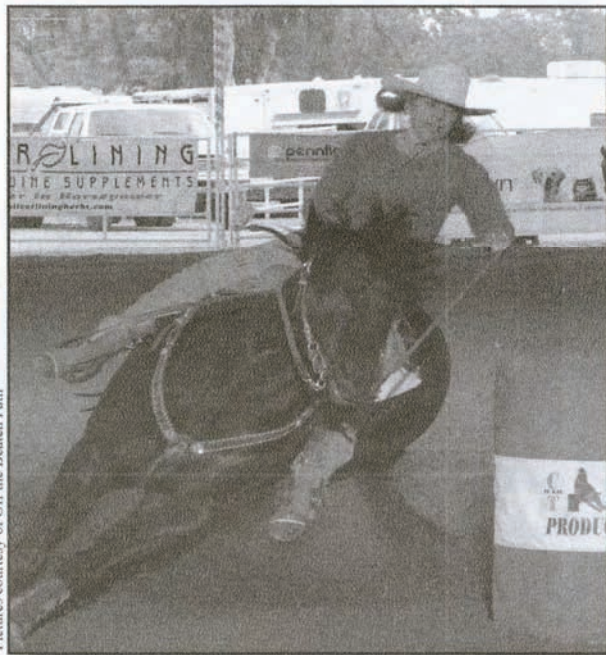


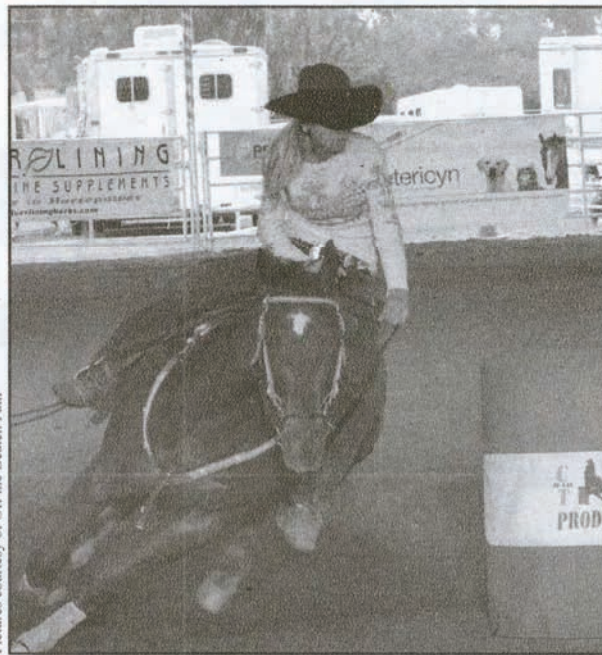
Drummond Beats the Competition at BTM South November Race

The C Bar T Productions have produced a whirlwind of great barrel races this year with tough running champions advancing their way to the top. No exceptions this weekend as the November 6th thru the 8th barrel race included the culmination of the California WPRA Women's Professional Rodeo Association season finale held at the Tulare Fairgrounds in California. C Bar T Productions gave out \$2500 in awards to average winners, \$1000 added in the WPRA Finals class with a beautiful Gist Buckle awarded to the winner.

"When the rubber meets the road" C Bar T had in fact paid out \$29,500.00 with just shy of 600 overall competitive entries for the remarkable weekend. The talented Doreen Drummond took the Open Average Championship riding Go Man Coastin and won the Championship Buckle with a prosperous \$756.17 in total winnings for their weekend. The astonishing duo best time of the weekend was a 15.290. "I have never won an average before, this is exciting," said Drummond. Her significant partner is a black gelding nicknamed "Romeo." Romeo's bloodlines go back to Go Man Go and that is the reason she traveled back to Kansas to buy the then two year old stud colt eight years ago. Drummond then raised and trained the amazing gelding herself. "I am proud of my horse, he is very consistent. These races are always run smooth and are a neat race to come to. It was tough competition this weekend and it was very exciting for me to end up ahead of the competition," said Drummond. Go Man Go had a Speed Index of 100, was inducted into the AQHA Hall of Fame and lived to be 30 years old. Romeo's bloodlines on the top side are Boston Mac a halter horse by Three Bars. Drummond said, "My future plans are to go ahead and rodeo this coming year."

The 2D Champion Buckle Winner in the Average went to Janelle Robinson riding her nice red mare Jet On Trouble Easy aka Trouble. This was their first time winning a BTM buckle and Robinson said, "I love the horse, she is an amazing girl." Robinson sorrel mare is 14 years old and she said that she "loves these races because of the fast ground and they are so well organized." It is also notable that Robinson just 18 years old also took home the CA WPRA Permit Standings buckle this weekend.

Carol Miller-Gonyer was the winner of the 3D Open Average and remarked, "these are pretty buckles." Gonyer was riding her seven year old paint mare My Gal Annie, a horse she has been riding for three years. She also said that "My Gal Annie is out of a thoroughbred mare and she is consistent and a joy to ride."

The 4D Average was won by the very deserving Joan Harding riding her new horse Doc Genuine Jewel. Joan's new eleven year old mare is bred Peppy San Badger AQHA 08 Hall of Fame, leading cutting horse sire and Cowbar on the bottom. Joan has been shoeing horses for over 40 years. The first rodeo that Joan ever entered was Reedwood City in 1956 with the GRA. Joan said, "I like the way that the C Bar T races are run. If they say they are going to start at 9AM, the first girl is going in at exactly that time." You can always trust that Joan has her shoeing equipment at every race she attends and is always available to tack a shoe on. "I can't tell you how many times I have put shoes on horses for other barrel racers," says Harding. And we are very grateful to Joan for that reason. Joan won two checks for a total of \$190.75.

The Youth Championship Buckle went to Aubrey Reese riding Bosco with a really fast time of 15.386 winning \$57.13 Aubrey

Reese who was right up there on Saturday running with the toughs winning the youth on her Mom's horse Bosco with a 15.386. Aubrey took home a very nice buckle for that beautiful run. The Division 3 Youth went to Payton Lopez riding Skeeter clocking 16.471 and winning her \$45.42. The 4D Youth was won by Cassidy Cook riding Boone Dock Playboy 18.152 and winning \$37.45

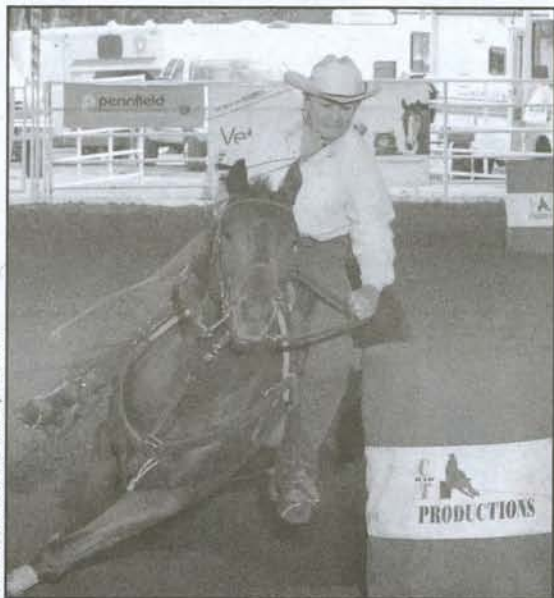
