The working facility for the bulls uses the most up-to-date hydraulic chute with a buffalo head gate called "the sure catch" to help catch the heads.

The young bulls had there

horns all tipped for the first time and some of the older bulls required re-tipping. This is no easy task and every safety precaution was made for both bull and handler. Heated horn irons are used to cauterize the horns after tipping and a spray is used for disinfectant.

Doug Pipkin and Bobby helped at the chute. Cody and Noel Cosca ear tagged all the bulls with their names written on the tags. Cody and Arturo brought the bulls up.

Jerry worked the bulls in the back corrals with his new son-in-law, Tim, who also served as our steak BBQ chef. Jerry's mother and wife, Sis Brown, made some great salads and desert.

Cosca Brown has some great looking young bulls coming up and they are growing fast. The Toro Bravo Arena has taken every effort to build their arena with twelve foot high pipe fencing using rubber matting for safety measures to ensure that your bulls can be trained without injury. All the lead up ally way and stripping chutes are lined with rubber belting for protection. Toro Bravo also takes great pride in their ground. It is river bottom ground with sandy soil which gives great footing, also great drainage in the winter.
